Directions:

From Marshfield go north on 97 toward Stratford. Make a right onto Hwy C toward Rozellville. In Rozellville, at the stop sign go left (north) on Hwy M. *A couple of miles beyond Rozellville, M makes a sudden turn. Follow M as it veers to the right, but when it veers back to the left, go straight onto a gravel road (Balsam), follow Balsam about a mile. You will pass a pond on the left. Look for a sign to the right of the road for the Heartland Hills subdivision. Turn right onto Heartland Hills Road. **When the road makes a "Y" stay to the left. It is the 3rd house (cedar with red doors)

From Wisconsin Rapids or Stevens Point go west on Hwy 10 toward Marshfield, but near Auburndale turn right onto Hwy M. Continue North through Rozellville, Then follow directions from *.

From the Wausau area go west on 153. You will be looking for Hwy H which is about 10 miles outside Mosinee. The landmark is Teasers. Turn left (south) on H. At the stop sign turn right onto Balsam (also a gravel road). Cross the bridge and look for Heartland Hills Road on the left. Follow directions from**.

Anachronists Book Review:

Lady Eve of Lynn

One of the first Authors that I reviewed in this column was Ed-ward Marston. That was in February 1995, I have followed the Elizabethan Theater Mystery series through the years. This series revolves around a group of actors known as Lord Westfield's Men. For some reason I have not been able to find the first book in the series. Recently Mistress Ealasaid sent me a copy of one of the earlier books in the series *The Mad Courtesan* This was first published in 1992 it was also one I had not been able to lo-cate. I wish to thank her for sending me this book to review. I have also followed Marston's series that follow the courts in set-tling disputes pertaining to the Domesday Books. Be it is the 11th century or the 16th you can't beat Marston for pure enter-tainment.

Well I Did it again, After thinning down my selection of books last year, I swore, I was not going to fall for any more book club offers. Well the people at the History Book Club put out a come-back offer I couldn't refuse. When the box containing my order came, I dropped every thing to delve into the first of Allison Weir's selections that I had chosen.

Eleanor of Aquitaine proved to be a very readable balanced account on the life of the most remarkable women of the Middle Ages. I can not see myself crossing a mountain range on horse back in the middle of winter at my age much less at the age of 80. I don't think Lady Anna could do it either.



Celebrating the New Year

New Years has not always been January 1 (and still is not in many cultures). The old Roman calendar started the New Year on March 1 so that the 7th, 8th, 9th and 10th months were appropriately named September (literally 7th), October (8th), November (9th) and December (10th). The Roman republic before 222BC considered the new year to be the day the consuls took office (the calends i.e. 1st day of May). Julius Caesar reorganized the roman calendar to start with January 1 and named the new first month January after the Roman deity Janus who symbolized doorways and therefore beginnings.

In the early middle ages in Europe, dating often started with an important feast day either Christmas, the Feast of the Annunciation (March 25), Easter, or occasionally the Feast of the Circumcision (January 1 since Jews circumcise on the 7th day). You will note that several of these dates (Christmas, Annunciation, and circumcision) are all related to Christmas being December 25 which is in itself controversial. Some evidence suggests that Jesus of Nazareth may have been born in the spring. In any case, through much of the middle ages Epiphany (later 12th Night) was a greater celebration than either Christmas or New Years.

The situation is further complicated by the change from the Julian to the Gregorian calendar in 1582 and disagreement as to the correct dating of Easter. This results in some Orthodox churches using different dating. Other countries (such as China) still use lunar dating so that the date of New Years varies relative to the Gregorian/Julian calendars. The Islamic new year also varies in comparison to the Gregorian calendar.

Some nations use spring (around the time of the vernal equinox) as their new year and probably have done so for centuries. This includes Persia, India, and much of southeast Asia, except Vietnam

which follows the Chinese lunar calendar.

Some northern nations have a tradition of using a date in fall as the new year. The ancient Celts celebrated the new year at Samhain (forerunner of Halloween). The Hebrew “head of the year” Rosh Hashanah also occurs in the fall.

The agreement to celebrate the new year on January 1 is relatively recent. The dates that January 1 became the official new year are as follows:

Venice	1522
Sweden	1525
Holy Roman Empire	1544
Spain, Portugal	1556
Denmark, Norway, Prussia	1559
France	1564
Scotland	1600

The Scots celebration of the New Year called Hogmany includes the first foot tradition. The first person to cross the threshold on New Years day, preferably a dark-haired male brings gifts to symbolize different kinds of luck. On traditional food is black bun, a sort of dark raisin cake with a pastry covering on the outside.

The unifying ideas seem to be that there is a time of new beginnings, often associated with various types of divination, practices for protection from evil, and resolutions for the future.
