Is It Period? New Year's Day

Answer: It depends on when and where you are. Originally, many people celebrated the New Year in Spring, near the time of the equinox. The Babylonians, for example, celebrated New Year's on the first new moon after the spring equinox.

In the original Roman calendar, January did not even exist. There were only 10 months in a year which went from the Kalends (1st) of March through September (7th month), October (8th month), November (9th month) and December (10th month). The second king of Rome, Numila Pontius, added January and February about 700 BC; and in 153 BC, January 1 became the start of the civil year when the newly elected consuls took office. In 46 BC the Julian calendar established January 1 as the start of the New Year. In keeping with their traditions of debauchery, later period Romans celebrated excessively. The early Christian church reacted by abolishing January 1 as New Years at the Council of Tours in 567.

Meanwhile, the pagan Celts started their year at Samhain (October 31). In the Hebrew calendar, Rosh Hashanah (in September to early October, 163 days after Passover) is the New Year for legal contracts and commemorates the creation of man. The Chinese, however, traditionally celebrated the New Year in the spring, and the traditional Hindu New Year is in mid-April.

Medieval Christian Europe did not have a single well established day for New Year's. It might be December 25, March 1, March 25 (the Feast of the Annunciation), or Easter. In some countries, January 1 was celebrated in a minor way as the Feast of Circumcision (because Jesus would have been circumcised on the 8th day following his birth in the Jewish tradition).

Finally in 1582, Pope Gregory XIII issued a papal bull, *Inter gravissimas*. This established the Gregorian calendar reform that fixed January 1 and the New Year. This was accepted almost immediately throughout the Catholic world, but Protestants were slow to adopt the change. In the British Empire, including the Colonies, the New Year was celebrated on Annunciation Day (March 25) until 1752 when the Gregorian calendar was officially adopted.

Assuming you figure out when to celebrate, most New Year traditions involve special foods and beverages, ritual cleansing, lights and fires, clearing or forgiving old debts and starting new things; so maybe New Year's resolutions could also be period (provided you make them in March).

Stay on Hwy S (it jogs to the west when you get to Hwy C) until you get to Hwy 153. Turn west (Left) on Hwy 153. Follow Hwy 153 to County Hwy H. Hwy H ends at 153 turn south (left) (At Teasers) Long Dr is on the left.

From Wausau/ Stevens Point - Take the Mosinee exit off of I39.

From Marshfield - Take County Highway Y (Becker Road) out of Marshfield until County Highway M. Turn left. Stay on M until you get to Hwy 153 (go straight through Rozellville).
